

AIADMK will push for lowering GST for match industry, assures Palaniswami



KOVILPATTI: AIADMK chief Edappadi K Palaniswami has said his party would push for lowering of GST rate for the match industry in order to support the sector. Addressing a poll campaign in Kovilpatti in Tuticorin district on Monday night, he said his party has sought a reduction in the Goods and Services Tax for the industry to 12 per cent from 18 per cent. "We will urge the centre to reduce 5 per cent GST for the match industry," the AIADMK general secretary assured.

The matchbox and fireworks industries are concentrated mostly in the Kovilpatti and Sivasamudram areas of Tamil Nadu, employing lakhs of workers. The former chief minister said his party previously took steps to reduce GST on the fireworks and match industries. TN ELECTIONS | CASE BOOKED AGAINST TVK CHIEF VIJAY UNDER FIVE SECTIONS FOR POLL CODE VIOLATIONS

CHENNAI: Actor-politician Vijay has been booked under five sections by Peravallur police for allegedly violating election rules during his campaign in Kolathur, officials said on Monday. According to the complaint filed by election authorities, Vijay is accused of using nearly 30 loudspeakers despite permission being granted for only five, thereby causing public disturbance.



According to a Daily Thanthi report, he has also been charged with gathering a crowd exceeding 5,000 people and obstructing the movement of an ambulance during the campaign. The case was registered based on inputs from the election monitoring team.

Thousands of supporters gathered to witness Vijay filing his nomination from the Perambur Assembly constituency, followed by his maiden roadshow towards Kolathur. The crowd surge led to severe traffic congestion across key stretches in north Chennai. Traffic movement was briefly disrupted near Vyasarpadi as motorists stopped to catch a glimpse of the actor. His convoy took nearly two hours to cover the short distance to Kolathur, getting stuck at major junctions such as Moolakadai and Thiru Vi Ka Nagar, as supporters thronged roads, climbed vantage points and halted traffic to take photos and videos.

TVK functionary files sexual harassment case against party's Poonamallee candidate

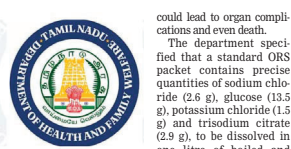

Use only WHO-approved ORS, warns Tamil Nadu health department amid rising heat

CHENNAI: With temperatures climbing steadily across Tamil Nadu, the State Health and Family Welfare Department has cautioned the public against relying on commercially marketed drinks sold as oral rehydration solutions (ORS), stressing that only World Health Organization-approved formulations can effectively treat dehydration.



Officials said the impact of summer has intensified across districts, with temperatures rising 2-4 degrees Celsius above normal levels, increasing the risk of dehydration, fatigue, dizziness and headaches, particularly during peak afternoon hours. In an advisory, the department warned that several ready-to-drink beverages marketed as ORS in bottles and cans do not meet prescribed medical standards. "Only WHO-approved ORS packets should be used to prevent and treat dehydration. Commercial beverages may provide temporary refreshment but are not medically adequate," an official said. ORS is a clinically proven intervention used to restore fluids and essential electrolytes lost due to diarrhoea, vomiting and excessive sweating. Officials noted that without timely and appropriate rehydration, severe electrolyte imbalance could lead to organ complications and even death. The department specified that a standard ORS packet contains precise quantities of sodium chloride (2.6 g), glucose (13.5 g), potassium chloride (1.5 g) and trisodium citrate (2.9 g), to be dissolved in one litre of boiled and cooled water and consumed within 24 hours. "WHO-approved ORS packets are available free of cost at government primary health centres and hospitals, and at low cost in private pharmacies. The public must ensure they use only these formulations," added the official. Residents have also been urged to drink adequate fluids such as water, tender coconut water, termilk and lemon juice, avoid direct sun exposure

between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m., and seek immediate care if symptoms of dehydration occur. Special caution has been advised for children.

Plastic health: Can you truly detox your body from plastic?

In The Plastic Detox, a new documentary on Netflix, six couples with unexplained infertility work to rid their lives of plastic in the hopes that doing so will improve their chances of having a baby. They toss out air fresheners and cutting boards, and try adopting bamboo toothbrushes and deodorant packaged in paperboard. "Will we get pregnant as a result of it?" one participant asks. "I have no idea," their guide on this journey is Shanna Swan, an 89-year-old researcher who has spent much of her career studying the effects of environmental chemicals on reproductive health. In the film, Swan, a professor of environmental medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York, inventories the sources of plastic in the participants' daily lives and identifies alternatives. Over a three-month "intervention period," she measures concentrations of chemicals in their urine and sperm counts. The premise of the documentary is appealing: cut plastic chemicals out of your life, and improve your fertility. But it is not that straightforward. "It's

Subsidy keeps UDAN aloft



The Union Government launched a high-profile regional air connectivity scheme with lofty goals, accompanied by predictable fanfare and publicity blitzkrieg. The Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik scheme, known by its cool acronym UDAN, ran into patches of turbulence and returned to the hangar for a revamp. The government has now come up with a Modified UDAN and is prepared to shell out Rs 28,800 crore to be spent over a decade. It plans to develop 100 airports from unserved airstrips and 200 modern heliports, besides focusing on market development and lending support for the operation and maintenance of aerodromes.

UDAN 1.0 faced serious setbacks due to a lack of demand and the resulting adverse impact on viability. Though the scheme expanded the airport network from double digits to triple digits, at least 22 airports became "non-operational." Some of these were in east and north-eastern states like West Bengal, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Mizoram, and Tripura, as these airports were supposed to improve connectivity to remote and underserved areas. According to the govern-

ment, 15 airports became non-operational under the UDAN scheme due to factors such as the end of the three-year Viability Gap Funding (VGF) support period, poor visibility conditions, daytime runway restrictions at VFR-only airports, shortage of aircraft, leasing issues, temporary discontinuation by airlines, novation of routes, and low passenger load factors. It is painfully obvious that the scheme was not well thought through and not backed by reliable studies relating to demand from the catchment area. Critics of the scheme argue that this could happen only when narrow political interests overshadow commercial rationale. For instance, over a dozen unutilised or underused airports were concentrated in Gujarat and Punjab, where people would not hop on to an aeroplane to go to places that could be reached in the same or lesser time by road.

A more serious issue, and a flaw in reasoning, was that the UDAN airports were originally intended to serve backward areas, but the people living in these regions were themselves economically constrained and could not afford air tickets. Secondly, by the government's own admission, there were issues relating to visibility because these bare-bones, minimalist airports lacked night navigation systems. The government could pump money into developing greenfield airports or merely upgrade airstrips into basic airports.
